

Careers in Biblical Studies

Bachelor's Degree

Churches and ministries require various educational requirements. A position at one church might require a postsecondary degree while the same position at another church might only require a high school diploma. Many church and ministry positions will require a bachelor's degree in a Bible or ministry related field. However, some churches may require a seminary or Master's degree.

Please be aware of this variance.

Church and ministry employers will view an educational understanding of the Bible and ministry as valuable assets, and therefore are more likely to hire a candidate who has completed biblical coursework. In addition to a degree, employers also want to see work experience in the industry.

Here are some examples of careers that may require or prefer a degree in a ministry related field (based on concentration).
